## The home with the nostalgic kitchen

Located in central Southampton, Hampton Lodge is a short stroll away from Watts Park and Southampton Common, while Southampton Central train station is just half a mile away, ensuring easy access for visiting families.

Purpose-built to meet diverse care needs of nursing and residential dementia, this 44-bedded home has sociable communal areas and direct access out into the pretty garden beyond.

Visitors frequently comment on our unusual 1970s-themed kitchen area, which was created as a space for residents living with dementia, to relax and reminisce. It's an interesting combination of chintzy wallpaper, retro furniture and classic crockery to evoke warm memories from decades past.

Care at Hampton Lodge is delivered with kindness, respect, and a deep understanding of each resident's needs. The home also specialises in end-of-life care, offering comfort to both residents and their families during difficult times.

At Hampton Lodge, care isn't just about meeting needs - it's about creating a calm, peaceful, and homely environment where residents and families feel supported every step of the way.
