Delights on your doorstep

Occupying a quiet village location six miles from Cambridge and six miles from Newmarket, Queens Court has proudly found itself as a focal point of the local community in Bottisham.

Local amenities certainly aren't an issue. There are a choice of shops within a short walk, a wonderful takeaway and much admired fish and chip shop. The local doctor's surgery is just a few hundred yards from the home, and if you're looking for a great local pub, you should look no further than The Bell.

We enjoy close connections to the Bottisham Social Club too. They're great supporters of our home, and our residents offer their own support in return – usually in the form of a regular shandy and weekly game of crib.

Each morning and afternoon, we're able to enjoy the sights and sounds of young children running to and from the neighbouring school. Many of whom join us for carolling at Christmas, harvest festivals in autumn, and all manner of other events and activities.

Our gardens are safe and secure, comprising four separate courtyards, filled with planters and beds for our own 'Pot Gang Group' of residents, and shaded by mature walnut and apple trees with their vivid blossoms in spring and delicious fruits in summer.

Picked young from the tree and dipped in salt, this much-loved treat has become a yearly tradition as our trees turn to red and bronze ahead of the autumn months.

It's perhaps no surprise that coffee and walnut cake is the home's signature dish either. But it's not all about snacks and bakes when it comes to the kitchens of Queens Court.

Our menus are designed to blend the very best of taste and nutrition, evolving each quarter and always informed by the ideas and input of our residents and their families. Arnold's greengrocer deserves its own mention... a stalwart of Bottisham's local high street, they've been filling our fridges and tables with the finest locally grown produce for as long as we can remember.

The hospitality at Queens Court is well-known amongst our local community too. Warm bacon and sausage butties await visiting groups and societies, with bottomless coffee always available and an open invitation to the people from our local health and emergency services.


