Built on the grounds of the former Warde Aldam Hospital, the home embraces its rich heritage, with historical photos displayed throughout. The home itself is purpose-built with three households, each offering direct garden access, ensuring residents feel connected to the outdoors. With spacious lounges, quiet rooms, and a community café, Warde Aldam offers both comfort and companionship.

# Support that Speaks for itself

There's a dedicated sensory room, designed with calming music and interactive visuals, offering a peaceful escape - particularly helpful for those living with dementia. And around the home, small touches make a big difference. Robotic pets, for example, have become unexpected favourites. One resident even became more engaged after spending time with a purring robotic cat - a quiet but meaningful shift.

Elsewhere, you'll find cosy lounges, a friendly community café, and a multi-faith space for quiet reflection. Residents' well-being is supported with regular visits from physiotherapists, opticians, and holistic therapists.

It's all about making every day feel as comfortable, connected, and "just right" as possible.


