Our outdoor spaces are something special – from the sweeping front lawn to the peaceful corners under mature trees, there's plenty of room to relax, chat, or simply enjoy nature. The front veranda is a favourite spot to sit with a cuppa and take in the view, while the sunny patio's perfect for catching up with friends.

To the side of the home, you'll find our secure, dementiafriendly sensory garden – an enclosed, calming space with seven raised flower beds, herbs, and vegetables. Designed to support wellbeing and connection, it offers a peaceful spot to relax, potter, or enjoy time with others. It was officially opened by the Mayor of Ilkley and adds another dimension to the home's welcoming outdoor areas.

The sunroom, linked to the main lounge, is always bright and welcoming – a great communal space all year round.

We also use our outdoor space to host our fabulous summer fair, garden party-style, complete with raffles, live performers, and our beloved ukulele band. And watch this space – a charming old barn is in line for a makeover into a vibrant events hub!

Good food, made with heart

When it comes to mealtimes, we don't just serve food – we serve comfort, memories, and a lot of second helpings! We're big on favourites here – roast dinners twice a week (yes, even midweek!), traditional puds like treacle sponge and pavlova, and birthday cakes made exactly how each resident likes them. Lemon drizzle? Chocolate fudge? You name it.

One of our much-loved kitchen assistant, Brendan, started here at 16. His mum and grandad both worked here before him, so it's fair to say the place runs in his blood. He brings warmth, energy and a real passion to the role – and now he's training to become a chef himself!

We've hosted themed food nights, baked crumbles from our own apples, and enjoyed plenty of laughs along the way. If someone's eating habits change, we sit down for a proper chat to find out what's going on – and tailor meals to get them back on track.

And for a relaxing catch-up with visitors, our cosy first-floor Bistro café is just the spot – coffee, cake and stunning Ilkley Moor views included.

It's a space that encourages conversation, reminiscence and connection – a much-loved feature that brings comfort, joy and a real sense of journey to daily life at Glen Rosa.

Animal lovers are in for a treat, with visits from alpacas, reptiles, rabbits, guinea pigs, and Neville – a charming Borderdale therapy dog who pops in weekly for cuddles and biscuits.

A local ukulele group performs regularly, with one of our own residents often joining in! We also use Famileo – a clever app that turns family messages and photos into a printed newsletter, helping residents stay connected in a personal, meaningful way.
